ABB RELEASES ITS LONG AWAITED CHRISTMAS CD

The Atlantic Brass Band is proud to present *"The Spirit of Christmas,"* our first CD in 6 years. The recording session took place January 11–13 at the Millville Middle School Performing Arts Center. Not only does the location have great acoustics but there was no one else in the school so we had perfect recording conditions. The weekend was divided into 5 sessions with time on Saturday and Sunday to enjoy meals together between the sessions. During the weekend the band also posed outside the school for its now famous "Lost in the Woods" photo which is on the inside sleeve of the CD as well as serving as the band's official NABBA program picture.

The band recorded 15 tracks including solo numbers by Bryan Appleby-Wineberg, cornet; Jack Deal, flugel; Amy Boyd, tenor horn; and Amy Bliss, euphonium.

The recording engineer on the project was Andrew Bove of Bove Audio, who also edited the CD with help from Music Director Salvatore Scarpa, Asst. MD Bryan A-W, and Matt Brown. The wonderful artwork and design was done by Deborah Lamir.

ABB KICKS OFF 30TH SEASON

Although our large-scale festivities will take place at the end of our 30th year, there is still a feeling of celebration here at ABB. We started the season with a very well attended Annual Fall Concert at Rowan. Although the program looked short on paper (only 6 numbers) there was a lot of music to listen to. Dr. Bryan Appleby-Wineberg performed Denis Wright's *Concerto for Cornet and Brass Band* on the 1st half of the program while Matt Walley played Martin Ellerby's *Concerto for Trombone*. Other longer works included the four movements of *Music from the Elizabethan Court* and Denis Wright's classic three-movement work *Tintagel*. The other numbers on the program were Richard Strauss' *Festmusik den Stadt Wein* to kick off the concert and Rimmer's classic march *Punchenello* to kick off the 2nd half. The audience was surprised and thrilled with the encores of *Bohemian Rhapsody* at the end of the 1st half and *Raiders of the Lost Ark* at the end of the second.

The band then headed to Bryan A-W's house for a band BBQ complete with burgers, dogs, chicken, and of course, beer! We were joined by Peter Bond, trumpet with the Metropolitan and one of Bryan's teachers, as well as many friends for a fabulous time. A great way to begin our 30th year!

December 1st had the band playing another member's recital. This time it was 1st baritone player Joe Sino's senior recital on euphonium. The band only needed to head around the corner to Our Lady of Lourdes RC Church in Glassboro. Again the band played the 2nd half of the recital with Joe performing *Pantomime* by Philip Sparke and *Michelangelo* by Sigvart Dagsland. We then got to relax and enjoy dinner at a reception given by the Sino family in the church hall.

THE BRITISH ARE COMING!



Lead with a British flair, the Mid-Atlantic Brass Band Festival is going into its 3rd annual event to be held at Rowan University March 15th & 16th. With clinicians from the key influence of brass banding, the United Kingdom, the festival will feature **Brett**

Baker, principal trombonist of Black Dyke Band. **Nigel Horne** is joining us again as a clinician who was born and raised in the United Kingdom. Nigel is on the Board of the North American Brass Band Association and Director of Rockville Brass Band.

Former Staff arranger to the “The President’s Own” United States Marine Band and Chamber Orchestra, **Stephen Bulla**, will be a clinician and as Musical Director of the “Brass of the Potomac” band, he will lead their performance as the featured band of the festival.

Other clinicians are from Rowan University. They are **Dr. Bryan Appleby-Wineberg**, Associate Professor of Trumpet and Head of Brass, and **Dean Witten**, Professor of Percussion and Director of Percussion Studies.

Other bands performing are Atlantic Brass Band, Chesapeake Silver Cornet Brass Band, Penn View Brass Band and Rockville Brass Band. This line-up will expand the regional presence of bands from Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Virginia.

The festival provides an opportunity for bands to be coached by leading international experts and for the public to enjoy the clinics, master classes and concerts. In its 2nd year, the Youth Solo Artist competition will be held for brass players and percussionists in middle and high school. This year, a college division has been added for brass players and will be judged by Stephen Bulla. BRETT BAKER AT 2014 MABBF



The Mid-Atlantic Brass Band Festival is very honored to have Brett Baker, principal trombonist of Black Dyke Band from the United Kingdom, as the lead clinician in the 3rd annual festival to be held on March 15th & 16th at Rowan University.

Principal trombone of the Black Dyke Band, Past-President of the British Trombone Society, and a clinician for Michael Rath Brass Instruments, Brett Baker is viewed as one of Europe’s leading brass performers and educators, and is passionate about encouraging composers to write pioneering new solo repertoire for the tenor trombone.

He is the most recorded trombone soloist in the UK and by the age of 24 had won every major British brass band competition.

In 2000 he was invited to join the Black Dyke Band under the direction of Dr. Nicholas Childs having further contest successes. As well as a playing schedule of 100 concerts a year, Brett enjoys presenting workshops specializing in solo performance.

In addition to his work as a performer, he is also acquiring a burgeoning reputation as a conductor and adjudicator. Having associations with many youth bands in the North of England, Brett has also achieved contest success with Northop, Ratby and Longridge bands.

Brett has been keen to promote new music for the trombone and has been involved with over one hundred commissions for the trombone.
